

Lifting Up East Wynnton: Building Beautiful and Safe Neighborhoods



Strategic planning is underway for a 3-year campaign to explore and rehabilitate the impact of racial and socioeconomic conditions in the Wynnton community.

On June 27, 2025, elected officials and Wynnton neighbors were invited to the Lifting Up East Wynnton kickoff event at 2822 Schaul Street. Event was catered by Skippers Restaurant

with cold beverages supplied by Publix Milgen Plaza.

A rich oral history describes a phenomenon of racial separation in Midtown called the Macon-Dixon Line. If one lives south of the Macon-Dixon Line, you're likely to be a person of color. North of the line, you're likely to be a person of European descent and better off economically.

Southern Anti-Racism Network (SARN) is headquartered on Schaul Street between Lawyers Lane and Briarwood starting in January 2024 when SARN founder Theresa El-Amin set up her new residence to include the SARN office.

East Wynnton is described as a source of Black Pride due to Black home ownership. Oral history shared links Black home ownership to the late 60s when the City of Columbus began to explore consolidation with unincorporated communities in Muscogee County like Midland.

City of Columbus was founded during slavery in 1828 on land stolen from the Creek Nation. In 1971, City of Columbus and Muscogee County formed the first Consolidated Government in Georgia.

On August 5, 2025, SARN will partner with Wynnton Methodist Church on National Night Out to call for "Unity in the Community" to prevent crime by establishing neighborhood watch committees block by block.







WORDS ABOUT WAR MATTER

A LANGUAGE GUIDE FOR DISCUSSING WAR AND FOREIGN POLICY

iscussions of war and foreign policy are full of dehumanizing euphemisms, bloodless jargon, little-known government acronyms, and troubling metaphors that hide warfare's damage. This guide aims to help people write and talk about war and foreign policy more accurately, more honestly, and in ways people outside the Washington, DC foreign policy "blob" can understand.

The word "defense," for example, can be a particularly misleading, Orwellian word used to describe warfare, budgets, and other things that often have little if anything to do with defense. Just because someone says something is "defense" doesn't make it true. In most cases "war," "Pentagon," or "military" are more accurate. Rather than "defense spending," say "Pentagon spending" or, following the AP Stylebook, "military spending." Rather than "Department of Defense," use "Pentagon." The former name, "Department of War," was more honest.

power projection	troop deployment, military deployment, bases and troops, overseas bases and troops, bases and troops abroad
precision bombing/airstrike, precision-guided munitions	bombing, airstrike, bomb/missile attack (if evidence shows they are guided: guided munitions/bombs/missiles)
targeted killing	assassination, extrajudicial assassination, killing, targeted assassination, murder
terrorism	acts of mass violence, attacks on civilians
terrorists	Avoid propagandistic labels and instead name the actions of groups.
war on terror, global war on terror	post–9/11 wars, post–2001 wars, so–called war on terror

MORE GUIDANCE

Use clear, accurate, descriptive language: Describe war's effects directly and honestly.

Avoid jargon of all kinds: military, foreign policy, Congressional, bureaucratic. Use clear, simple, descriptive language.

Avoid acronyms/initialisms: Like jargon, they exclude outsiders and obscure what's going on.

Avoid Pentagon, military, and Congressional language almost always: It also excludes and obscures. Find the clearest, most accurate language.

Avoid sports metaphors: War is not sport. Sports metaphors hide war's human damage.

Avoid medical metaphors: War is not medical practice. War is never surgical or hygienic.

Avoid war, gun, and other violent metaphors: For example, "rally the troops," "on the frontlines," "pull the trigger," "smoking gun," "you killed it."

Share alternatives gently: Shaming people's language is unhelpful. Explain. Discuss. Share the guide as a resource. Invite conversations about how words shape how we perceive the world and thus war and foreign policy.

Use these suggestions consistently, in all settings: Changing language can feel hard, even if it's more accurate. The more we use accurate language, the easier it becomes.







HISTORY

Founded in 1891, we are one of the world's oldest peace federations. The organisation is a Nobel Peace Prize Laureate (1910), and over the years, 14 of our officers have been recipients of the same prize.

WHAT WE DO?

Since 1992, the IPB has awarded the Seán MacBride Prize to individuals and organisations that have made outstanding contributions to peace, disarmament, and/or human rights. In addition, networking and coordinating webinars, educational events, street protests, demonstrations, petitions, declarations, and statements—addressing both local and international peace and conflict issues—together with our global partners and regional working groups, are core components of our work.

MEMBERSHIP

By becoming an IPB member - as an individual or an organisation - you become part of the IPB family and our diverse and global network of peace activists, labor unions, environmental organisations, social movements, educational groups, and more.

OUR CAMPAIGNS

An important branch of our work is based on the concept of <u>Common Security</u>—the idea that nations and populations can only feel safe when their counterparts feel safe—developed by Olof Palme's Independent Commission on Disarmament and Security.

Another key area of our work is the Global Campaign on Military Spending (GCOMS) built on over a decade of efforts by IPB and others around the theme of 'Disarmament for Sustainable Development.' It incorporates the Global Days of Action on Military Spending (GDAMS).

We also participate in various peace and disarmament initiatives and campaigns such as Global Governance, Global Women United Against NATO, Stop Rearm Europe, Neutrality Congress, Global Week of Action for Peace and Climate Justice, Global Solidarity for Palestine, and many more.


